### **Data Snapshot**

- 44,547 total lab-confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Iowa (07/31/2020).
  - 568 total lab-confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Cerro Gordo (07/31/2020).
  - o 220 total recovered in Cerro Gordo
- 866 deaths in Iowa
  - 17 deaths in Cerro Gordo
- 11,804 COVID-19 tests administered at the mobile testing unit (07/30/2020).
